Café Cuba is another fund raiser for the Cuba Partnership but why are we contributing to “*guest house*” construction at Luyanó? Is that a mission project?

Yes! Resources will continue to decline for support of mission projects of the Presbyterian Reformed Church in Cuba as Cuba reforms its dual currency economy. That is because foreign support is expected to drop dramatically in buying power.

Why is that important?

The internal life of each Cuban congregation is funded fully by its congregants in communities where the **average family income is between the equivalent of 20-30 American dollars a month.** On the other hand, although churches provide the mission project work and sites, community mission projects are almost fully supported by hard currency donations of U.S. partners. Under the U.S. embargo, “humanitarian projects” are the only legal way our gifts can be used there. Projects like feeding programs, community gardens, potable water, laundry for the elderly etc. are among just a few of the local projects. (Some Korean and European churches also help the Cuban Church Synod more broadly).

What are Cuban Presbyterians doing to address this possible collapse of mission project support?

Every Cuban congregation is scrambling to find a sustainable source of funds to make themselves less dependent on external support. Anything they do must fall within rigid guidelines of the Cuban Government for “religious associations” which protestant churches are deemed to be. Options are limited and government permission is required.

Luyanó’s first effort is a printing press which is up and running. (It prints materials for other churches for a small fee). **The guest house is being constructed in the church parking area.** With the heavy increase in travel to Cuba since the U.S. relaxation of relations, Cuba has found itself without enough tourist lodging. Luyanó took advantage of that, gained government permission for construction, and expects to receive from the guest house a sustainable source of community mission funds.

Can we help in this monetary crisis for the churches?

Absolutely! American hard currency has not yet lost its value relative to the national peso. Construction supplies are bought with the national peso. Dollars that we spend now to support their construction will be more valuable than after currency reform, and through the guest house, our gifts will **“keep on giving.”**


