Pastor's Pen

As we begin Lent I am ever more conscious of Christ's call and the implications of that call upon my life. Life has a way of sorting out those things that are truly important as we seek to pay attention and listen to God's Word and Spirit. I see more clearly past compromises, failings, and sins. I also am becoming more deeply aware of God's unfailing love and grace. God knows "how we were made; he remembers that we are dust" (*Psalm 103:14*).

To a generation of God's people whose hearts had turned and were not steadfast or true to God's covenant, a people who had forgotten, the Psalmist directs us to the nature of God's character. Listen to the profound compassion of God's heart for us; "Yet he, being compassionate, forgave their iniquity, and did not destroy them; often he restrained his anger, and did not stir up all his wrath. He remembered that they were but flesh, a wind that passes and does not come again" (Psalm 78:38-9). C.S. Lewis observes that we may ignore the presence of God, but nowhere can we evade that presence. God is everywhere, walking around incognito, though not inaccessible. The real work for us is to remember, to attend, to come awake and then remain awake to that presence. Lewis goes on to say, and I will allow him to do so in his own words; "Oddly enough, what corroborates me in this faith is the fact, otherwise so infinitely deplorable, that the awareness of this presence has so often been unwelcome" ('Letters to Malcom: Chiefly on Prayer').

Lent is a time for us to remember and welcome God's presence into our lives. We are called to come awake, to remember who we are and who God is. God's invitation through Joel is relevant for us; "Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing" (*Joel 2:12*).

Our Lenten theme is, "Listen Up! Jesus Speaking". To assist us in our Lenten journey take a look at the spiritual practices that are included in the bulletin each week. During our worship we will incorporate times for silence and quiet reflection.

I especially encourage you to spend some time in the Lenten Spirituality Center in the Narthex of the church. As I stopped and allowed myself to experience each

Memorial Fund

What happens to donations made to the church in a deceased members honor? One of the many funds managed by the Finance Committee is the Memorial Fund.

This Fund is comprised of donations made in memory of a deceased member of our church. Some of the donations are designated for a specific purpose but most are not. This leaves the decision of how to use these General Memorial Funds up to the Finance Committee and Session.

However, when the amount of memorial donations is large, the pastors, with the advice of the Finance Committee, will consult with the family on how to utilize the funds.

The balance in the General Memorial Fund at the end of 2016 was \$41,379 and is the result of donations made in the honor of 44 members.

In the development of the 2017 Budget the Finance Committee recommended and the Session approved the expenditure of \$13,700 from the General Memorial Fund as follows:

- \$5,000 for Community Missions
- \$6,000 for World Missions
- \$2,700 for Staff Training

These funds allow the church to continue to support our mission activities and staff beyond what will be available from our limited income in 2017.

A donation given in the memory of a member of our congregation is a wonderful way to honor the member's life. This is especially valuable to our church in supporting existing programs in times of financial stress and in providing initial funding for new initiatives by the church. Monthly Contributions: Contributions in February continued a strong start to 2017, exceeding February 2016 by \$32K and the budgeted amount by \$7K. The year to date (YTD) exceeds last year by \$61K and the budgeted amount by \$42K. This strong start contrasts with a decrease of \$47K in prepaid pledges (i.e. paid in the year before the pledge year) for 2017 compared to 2016. Note that prepaid contributions are prorated with 1/12ths added to each month's contributions.







Constant in Prayer

How is it possible to "pray continually" as God says in I Thessalonians 5:17? How can I make prayer as consistent as breathing? To find the answer we look at verses 16 and 18. First we are told to "be joyful always." We can be joyful because taking our sorrows to God in prayer is healing. This gives a desire to "pray continually."

Finally we "give thanks in all circumstances" because God has helped us in the past and will help us in the future.

Today let us remember to be joyful, pray continually and thank God.
