Mid-Year Report

Operating Budget: As presented in Table 1, both revenue and expenses were less than budget projections with the net result a \$19,000 positive balance but about \$24,000 short of the projected balance for the first half. First half revenue is inflated by pledges of \$137,000 for 2016 paid in 2015. Total revenue for the first half of 2016 was \$21,600 less than in 2015 and expenses were \$38,000 less. Both pledged contributions and non-pledge contributions (plate) are trailing contributions in 2015 with the latter substantially trailing 2015 by \$15,000.

Restricted Cash Accounts: As shown in Table 2, funds in cash accounts for both endowment and other restricted accounts increased slightly in the first half of the year. Non-endowment funds include \$84,851 in the F-150 Mission account at the end of June.

Investment Portfolio with Busey Wealth Management (BWM): Investment gains of 2.8% were realized in the first half for the BWM investment pool. During the period, contributions of \$916 were received, endowments distributions of \$4,003 were made, and fees of \$6,928 were paid resulting in the gain shown in Table 2. Endowment principal is invariant and changes in the other components in the investment pool are shown in Table 2.

Forward 150: At the end of June, contributions of \$1,586,924 had been received, which is about 80% of the total pledged, and total expenses were \$973,889. Expenses include a total of \$130,000 that has been transferred to Missions. Major projects (>\$200K) completed or near completion include the fire sprinkler system, the organ, and technology upgrades. The major remaining project is the stained glass windows and a number of smaller projects, including a new outdoor sign.

Other: A final payout of \$14,406 was received from the Creamer trusts which was placed in an account for expenses related to the search for a new senior pastor. A bequest of \$9,160 from the George Leonard trust was received, which was included in annual operating income to reduce the deficit for this year.

2016 Projections – Second Half: Expenses are likely to be higher in the second half with the salary of the new CYF director coming on-line. To meet our projected revenue in the budget, it will be important for contributions in the second half to increase, particularly non-pledged plate contributions which are only 35% of projected in the budget which was based on 2015 contributions. Overall, the original projected deficit in the budget of about \$40,000 is still a reasonable, but quite soft, estimate taking first half results into account.

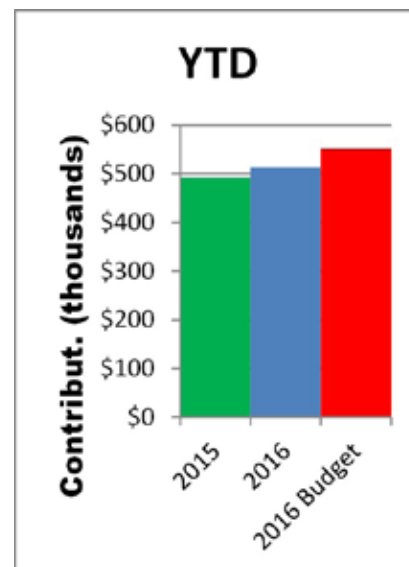
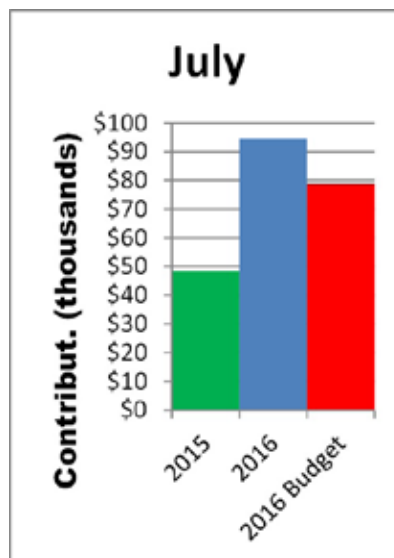
Monthly Contributions: I missed the July newsletter but in June (not shown), contributions were slightly higher than in 2015, but substantially lower than projected in the budget. July was a very strong month exceeding a weak July 2015 by \$46K – a good start to the second half. 2016 YTD is \$21K ahead of 2015, but about \$39K less than the YTD budget projection.
