Pastor's Pen

I have been impressed with the metaphor of Israel wandering in the wilderness. As we go deeper into this interim time, we continue to seek ways that God is moving us more deeply to trust the work of the Holy Spirit among us.

Speaking to Israel's personal experience, the Psalmist writes, "Some wandered in desert wastes...hungry and thirsty, their soul fainted within them". Though our journeys are not the same, an interim period has the potential to feel like a desert wasteland and when extended may exhaust the soul as no apparent progress is being made. As I mentioned Sunday, it is easy to become discouraged, draw back, and put our giving and engagement on hold (*Psalm 106:4-9*).

Actually, God's people did what is the most necessary thing that they could do. "Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble". Prayer is most needed and powerful during those times when we are most in touch with our struggling humanity. Our energy and self-effort alone fail us. It is the paradox Paul shares with us when he is at the end of himself. God says to him in the face of unanswered prayer, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weaknesses...whenever I am weak then I am strong" (2 Corinthians 12:9-10).

So what happened to God's people when, exhausted, they cried to him? "He delivered them from their distress; ...he led them by a straight way, until they reached an inhabited town". God tunes in to us when we tune in to God.

God is asking you and me to pray and look for God's sustaining guidance during this time. It is easier to succumb to our discouragement than look to God through the eyes of faith. It is helpful to look around and identify those places where we see God's Spirit afoot.

Reality is the present, what we as a congregation are in the moment, what our environment and mood is at this time. Regardless, we always assume that God is up to something. We can't easily identify it, but we suspend judgement, lifting our eyes to God in trust.

The result of such prayer is gratitude and praise. As the writer of Hebrews tells us, "And without faith it is impossible to please God, for whoever would

approach him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him" (verse 6).

And so the Psalmist proclaims, "And let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works humankind. For he satisfies the thirsty, and the hungry he fills with good things" (verses 8-9). We have faith that God will give us what we need.

Our stewardship slogan this year is, *Faith* in the Future. We have that faith because of who God is, what God is doing, and what God is promising to do. Such faith and prayer have been tested and proven throughout generations, for "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).

Nurture gratitude. Look around and see where God is at work. Pray. Ask God what you could do that would honor and bring blessing to him and the church during this interim time.

Please prayerfully consider what your contributions will be for 2017 to keep our church on a firm financial foundation that will help ensure a future in which our faith, and that of our community, can grow well into the future.

The Stewardship campaign will kick off on Sunday, Oct 9 with a Minute for Stewardship at our services and the following three Sundays will feature Minutes for Stewardship highlighting Missions; Children, Youth, and Families; and Worship. There will be a budget information session on October 16 immediately after the 9:00 services. The pledge cards with budget and program information will be mailed the week of October 10. The deadline for pledges will be Tuesday, November 1.


Stewardship Is More Than Dollars



Our stewardship campaign will be running through October and I would guess most of us think about the campaign in terms of what our financial gifts to the church will be for the next year. It is, however, also a good time to think about our equally, if not more, important contributions of time and talents – volunteering. I heard an estimate recently that as many as 200 of our members have volunteered in some way for the Church this year. This level of donation of time and talent is certainly impressive and demonstrates the commitment of our congregation to the Church. In addition, volunteers can save money.

In spite of our substantial volunteer effort, we need more volunteers. We need more Sunday school teachers, ushers, greeters, and many others. Volunteering is not only beneficial to the Church, but can be a personally rewarding experience. So at this time when we focus on stewardship and our financial gifts to the Church, please think of ways you could contribute your time and talents to further the work of Christ through our Church.

Monthly Contributions: September contributions trailed September 2015 by about \$16K bringing the YTD for 2016 to \$42K behind 2015. This is a bit surprising since pledges for 2016 were 5% more than in 2015, so hopefully there will be some catch-up in the last quarter of 2016. YTD contributions for 2016 are \$87K behind the budgeted amount.
