Go and Serve 2015: Cuba

My desire to go to Cuba started about a year and a half ago. I had been attending The Gathering at First Presbyterian for a few months when I heard about the Cuba Study. I was intrigued and on a whim asked around to find out how to get involved. I am a shy person, so I was a little nervous at the first meeting. However, I walked away with a strong desire to learn more about our neighbors and their culture, history, and (most especially) their food. The group I studied with prepared for a trip in September, but I was not able to join them due to my work schedule. The following spring, I was asked to go on the March trip, but again was not able to go. Strike two. By this time I was determined to go on the next trip no matter what. Not long after making this decision, God intervened by the way of Kristen Plemons who asked me if I would consider going with the Go and Serve Team to Cuba. Finally, I updated my passport and it was time to go.

The trip was so much more than I could ever have imagined. I knew we were to spend the time with the people, but wasn't certain what to expect. From the time we made it out of the airport at Havana, we were welcomed. We were guided and spent the afternoon at the beach getting to know some of the people from the church. To start the trip, the high school girls with us were at first afraid to ask the youth to play ball with them. They eventually gained courage to go over to where they were seated, but diverted paths. They took the time to try and figure out how to ask in Spanish, but

were too nervous to follow through. However, after the youth asked us to go for a walk on the beach, everyone relaxed and they ended the day playing volleyball.

The language barrier was a little difficult throughout the week. I was able to pick up a few things, but there were times when I had no clue what I was being asked or told. However, both the Go and Serve Team and the Cuban youth worked as a team to understand each other. We used broken English and Spanish and pantomime. One of the more memorable experiences with our language barrier was we asked one of the Cuban youth "Como se dice 'train?'" The response: "Tren," when pronounced sounds the same in English or Spanish.

My favorite part of the trip was our home visits. We got to know the families of our hosts and share even more with them. We laughed together, danced together, and shared meals together. I know I speak for the group when I say how much we loved being with the church and the people. I am thankful for the opportunity to have gone on this trip. I am thankful to have spent time with the church at Luyano and with the group here in Champaign, growing in our faith together. In the end, I believe that's the point of the trip and of the relationship between both churches. We are all one in Christ. Through our time together building relationships, we are able to grow in faith and love, to encourage each other as we serve our respective communities, sharing the love of Christ.
