## Children's Mission Opportunities

As part of the new children's education hour opportunities, the Children, Youth, and Family Ministry team is offering the children an option to contribute to the greater mission of the church. Each Sunday from 10-10:30am, children are invited to the cafe within the Education Building to participate in a project to support local and/or national partner organizations.

The first project has been the creation of polar fleece tie baby blankets for donation to Empty Tomb. The children have also contributed to the Salvation Army Canteen Run by making 25 peanut butter and jelly sandwiches for delivery. The children are also making cards to send to Sangla Hill Girls' School in Pakistan, to greet children who attend there.

We are looking for more ideas for projects the kids can be involved in. We also need caring adults to be present and help guide the children through making the projects. Bob and Kristi Rice have reported about recent killings in the Congo, even some in the city they serve. Citizens are fighting against the government and against each other, resulting in at least 49 deaths the last week of September alone. During the most recent attack, children at the Ditekemena (HOPE) program, had to scatter to the woods to hide for a couple of days for their own safety. The program's food stores were looted, and the supplies won't get there for a couple of weeks. In addition, protests and killings have occurred in the country's capital, Kinshasa, related to the politics of the area (such as political prisoners).

Please be in prayer for peace in the Congo, for resolution to these conflicts, and for the children suffering because of these conflicts. For more information, and for more ways to pray, read their blog at bobandkristi.blogspot.com.

The Canteen Run serves 100-200 C-U guests in a typical week.

These guests are currently living on the streets.

Their current donation needs are medium, large, xl, and 2xl men's underwear, all sizes of women's underwear, deodorant, razors, and socks. They need to stock up for the winter months, and are already accepting long-sleeved shirts, large, xl, 2xl coats, blankets, and long underwear.

The Canteen Run always needs volunteers and drivers, and are in serious need for weeknight drivers. In order to drive, you need to fill out an application at The Salvation Army at 2212 N. Market St. You do NOT need a CDL to drive. 
Mission Possible is helping Camp Carew by building some interior walls in an existing cabin built by Mission Possible years ago.



## A Better Way Workshop Leaders



Matt Burgess, MA, LCPC is the Chief Operating Officer of Home Sweet Home Ministries in Bloomington, IL. HSHM is an independent Christian ministry serving people who are experiencing homelessness and/or living in poverty. They have served the Central Illinois community for almost 100 years and currently operate a shelter for homeless individuals and families, a low income food co-op, a mobile health project, and several other services to people dealing with homelessness and poverty. In addition to managing the programs and services at Home Sweet Home Ministries, Matt is a tireless advocate of building systems of support that foster dignity and worth and provides consulting services to other non-profits and communities who are interested in improving their models of assistance.



Nathan Montgomery is cofounder and Executive Director of Salt & Light in Champaign, IL. Since opening in 2004, he has led Salt & Light into a community leader in poverty alleviation efforts. Through Nathan's visionary leadership, Salt & Light has developed an innovative and unique approach that is radically transforming how communities address poverty.

Nathan's passion for people and the community he calls home have driven him to serve on local Financial Stability and Food Insecurity task forces, as well as the Champaign County Rural Transit System. Most recently, he was named to the Christian Community Development Association's National Leadership Cohort. A sought after speaker on poverty related issues, Nathan actively challenges the existing systems designed to address them.



Nathan Lenstra is married to his lovely wife, Lauren, and they have a beautiful daughter, Hannah. Nathan has been involved in ministry with impoverished communities since 2004, since 2007 in Danville, IL through his church, Connexion. He loves to work with children and youth, especially helping young African-American men transition to adulthood and become mature in Christ and in life so that they avoid the traps of poverty, drugs, gangs, unemployment, etc. Nathan has a B.S. in chemistry education from the University of Illinois and a M.Div. from Urbana Theological Seminary. In his free time, he enjoys spending time with his family and gardening and is hoping for a long-awaited World Series championship from the Cubs this year!
