



In Champaign County, the average evening temperatures begin to dip below freezing in December, and stay below freezing until April.

Homeless men in Champaign County now have a safe, warm place to stay at night in the winter months thanks to a unique community collaboration between faith leaders, homeless service providers and United Way. From December 1 through March 31, New Covenant Fellowship Church in Champaign will open their doors every evening to shelter homeless men.

A highly trained director and four part time staff alternate evenings overseeing the shelter guests and volunteers. A strong relationship with local law enforcement ensures the safety of all. The cost to operate the shelter for four months is \$50,056.

Here in central Illinois, United Way of Champaign County is fighting against homelessness and helping improve community conditions for all. We believe

strongly that everyone in our community deserves a safe, warm place to sleep.

Weekly Shelter Budget for 2017-2018

Payroll	\$2,000
<small>includes salaries and workers compensation insurance, assumes one director and four staff, 40 hours per week total</small>	
Rent, Utilities & cleaning	\$425
Laundry	\$400
Insurance	\$25
Miscellaneous	\$125
Total Weekly Budget	\$3,000

- Average of 20 men used the shelter nightly
- 111 total unique men stayed at the shelter
- The average low temperature in Central Illinois in January is 16 degrees
- The cost to operate the shelter for one week is \$3,000—\$428 a night.
