

#### Raindrop Project 2018

It's that time of year again – time for the Missions
Ministry Raindrop Project – an opportunity to support a special Mission Project with generous hearts. As you may recall, we are asked to choose a paper "raindrop" from a variety of raindrops on a bulletin board with varying dollar amounts printed on them. The funds received are then donated to a special project.

The project this year is a

ministry called *Healing Hearts* and was suggested by Christi Boyd, our Mission Co-Worker in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Christi has been deeply involved with this project: a training program for professionals who work with victims traumatized by violence.

Healing Hearts training staff teach professionals (teachers, social workers, medical personnel) who might encounter traumatized victims how to help these victims heal from the trauma. They work with adults and children.

The next training session will focus on Children's Trauma Healing. The Healing Hearts children's program (for children 9 – 13) consists of either a one week "camp" or ten weekly sessions that focus on concepts such as ...(continued on page 2)

Happen," Saying How We
Feel," "Loss and Grief,"
"Rebuilding Lives" and
others. The professional
facilitators use strategies
such as stories, games,
drawings, crafts, songs, and
others. This program has
been used in various parts
of Africa and facilitators
report observing

significant changes in the children by the end of the program.

Our donations will help to provide lodging, meals, materials, and travel expenses for those professionals training to be *Healing Hearts* facilitators in the Democratic Republic of Congo. We can support this vital ministry by visiting the Raindrop table set up in Westminster Hall on July 15 and July 22.
