Pastor's Pen

We enter the New Year amidst looming questions. What will the coming year bring to our church? How will the nations of the world work together as we face the challenge of ISIS and terrorism? Who will this nation choose as its new president and congressional leaders? The questions go on and on.

Our questions lead in one of two directions. One is the road of anxiety and fear. This path takes us away from God. Anxiety and fear never produce good outcomes. They are bad bedfellows.

The other takes us on the road of faith and trust. It leads us into the heart of God's omniscient eye where we cannot be moved from the abiding love and security of God's presence. The Psalmist puts it this way, "As the mountains surround Jerusalem, so the Lord surrounds his people..." (*Psalm 125:2*) From this center we engage the world that God calls us through Christ to join him and serve. Faith takes the first step even if we do not see the blueprint of God's design while continuing trust holds us steady as we go.

And so we discipline ourselves each day to stay centered upon the person of Christ whose Spirit indwells us. Daily we are reminded that "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain" (Psalm 127:1). We can't do God's work alone, but we can allow God to do God's work through us.

Our spiritual relationship with Christ is deeply connected to our passion for doing ministry through ESL, CYF, our partnership with Cuba, Sangla Hill Girls School in Pakistan, the embracement and inclusion of our Congolese and other immigrant neighbors, and our commitment to Compassion, Peace, and Justice as well as our outreach via Courageous Conversations.

Martin Luther King, Jr. reminds us that "Life's most persistent and urgent question is, 'What are you doing for others?'" Our Community Mission Deacons partner with local community agencies to offer support and participation with people's basic needs through hands on activities and monetary gifts. World Mission supports the work of our missionaries around the world in places like the Democratic Republic of Congo, Indonesia, the Caribbean and others.

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Email/Phone Scams

At least two church members have recently had their email accounts compromised, resulting in fraudulent emails going out purportedly from the members. These emails had requests for money to be sent, allegedly to the person to help with travel issues after being robbed. You may have received counterfeit emails from these members or from others, as this is a fairly common scam. You can read more about it at www.snopes. com/fraud/distress/family.asp.

The bottom line is that you should always attempt to contact by a different method the person supposedly sending the email (or phone call, as is sometimes the case). Or, you can check in with the church office to see if we have heard about any such need. It is unfortunate that we have to be leery of such requests for help, but we must do so in order to be able to help when genuinely needed.

You can learn about other email scams (often known as "phishing scams") at security. illinois.edu/content/phishing. The Federal Trade Commission also provides a helpful page with information about a variety of different scams at www.consumer.ftc.gov/ scam-alerts.

Additionally, there are a number of telephone scams, including ones where the caller pretends to be from the IRS and demands payment. To read more about this, go to www.irs.gov and search for "phone scam."

We hope this information will help you to stay safe!

We took a two-week break for Christmas and the New Year. On December 21, we posted at the PCUSA website our job announcement, our description of our church, and the anticipated duties and most desirable characteristics of our next pastor/head of staff. (If you would like to see our job announcement and supporting document, we have placed several copies in the Church Library and will soon be posting it to a "Pastor Search" tab on the Church's website.)

The Church Leadership Connection ran a match between the personal information forms (PIFs) on file and our ministry information form (MIF) and within a day returned 25 potential candidates. Over the next week and a half we have had another 10 or so self-referrals. We are very pleased and encouraged by these responses. We have also had several promising referrals from members of the congregation. And we are reaching out to other contacts around the country so as to cast as wide a net as we can.

Beginning this month, we are going to be reading the PIFs that have been and will be submitted to us. Our goal is to identify a group of candidates with whom to have interviews and about whom we would be eager to learn more.

We are happy to talk with any of you about the process, although we must maintain confidentiality about the candidates whom we are considering. We welcome your suggestions of candidates, but we would ask you to contact those candidates and ask them to view our MIF at PCUSA (or, soon, on our website) and submit their PIFs to us at pnc.fppc@gmail.com. We also ask for your continued patience and prayers for our discernment and judgment in this wonderful, daunting search.

Stewardship & Generosity 2016




We kicked off our Stewardship/Generosity campaign for 2016 with an ambitious goal of increasing our pledged contributions by 10%. The response of the congregation was wonderful. Total pledged contributions for 2016 were \$807,701 from 197 pledging units compared to \$764,216 from 206 pledging units for 2015. The average pledge for 2016 of \$4,100 was about 10% higher than the average pledge for 2015 – right at our goal of a 10% increase.

Nevertheless, since the number of pledging families decreased in 2016, we were \$29,000 short of the amount of pledges required to fund all the requests from our programs. In December, Session agreed to \$29,000 of reductions in the requested amounts to bring us to our target of contributions equal to 89% of budgeted expenses. Reductions that were made generally brought the budget item to or above 2015 levels. The one exception was our ESL program for which reductions were made that are expected to be made up by free will contributions from participants in ESL classes who are able and willing to contribute. Our church will still provide over 80% of the financial support for the ESL program.

While short of our pledge goal by 3% in 2016, it is important to keep in mind that our total projected revenue for 2016 including estimates for non-pledged contributions and other income is about \$1,030,000. Thanks to the generosity of present and past members, our church is truly blessed financially and can do wondrous things in the name of Jesus. Next month: 2015 review.

Monthly report. Contributions in December were \$13,500 greater in 2015 than in 2014, but year to date trailed 2014 by \$7,500. Contributions year to date trailed the projected contributions in the budget by \$33,000.





F150 Update

Progress since last month on Phase 1 Expenditures items:

- Hatter's Organ Repair was on site December 9th and 10th to install the last of the "offset chests" for the tall organ pipes and to re-install the corrected software enabling the pipes to be played from the console.
- o After test-playing the pipes for the first time, about 30% of them were found to be playing non-stop, or "ciphering".
- o This is normal, but will require Hatter's to return for an estimated two weeklong voicing session in January. During this session Hatter's will find and fix all the ciphers in preparation for final voicing by the expert, Gerry Orring.
- MATCO began installing fire sprinkler piping in the church December 18. The current installation schedule is:
- o January 4, 2016 start installation at the first floor (Westminster Hall level)
- o January 18 start installation at the second floor (Sanctuary level) o February 5 – end installation
- o Week of February 8 testing, inspections, fire alarm system modification
- Mid-Illinois Concrete and Davis-Houk Mechanical are complete with their work adding the new 6" water service and backflow preventer to the property. This work provides a water source and backflow protection for the church building new fire sprinkler system.
- o Mid-Illinois Concrete has passed City of Champaign inspection for repairing / replacing City paving which was disturbed.
- o Davis-Houk Mechanical passed City of Champaign initial inspection for back-

flow preventer check valves operation.The F150 committee is pursuing options

for the exterior signage.

- Brush Architects (Mary Brush) is underway developing construction documents for the stained glass windows and frames restoration work.
- o The largest sanctuary window (center window of the three on the east wall) will be restored first.
- The technology upgrade project is complete.
- The F150 committee believes it is prudent to wait until the stained glass windows restoration work is complete before the plaster repair project is undertaken.

Session Notes

- Approved rehabilitation of the church office;
- Approved the Director of Children, Youth & Families be a full-time position;
- Approved the proposed Outreach plan;
- Approved use of space in the ESL office for 4 hours per week by East Central Illinois Refugee Mutual Assistance Center;
- Approved the formation of a committee to plan a celebration for the 150th anniversary of the church.

Benevolence Fund: Opportunity to Share

"Caring for those in need through no fault of their own is integral to the Gospel. After the Good Samaritan picks up the wounded man, takes him to an inn, and pays for his expenses, Jesus says, 'Go and do likewise.' True Christian behavior is defined by James as, 'looking out for orphans and widows in their distress.' Jesus tells us that when we care for a hungry or thirsty person, it is as though we are caring for Him, 'For I was hungry and you gave me something to drink, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in.' The Benevolence Fund is a modest effort to answer this call for our brothers and sisters as emergency needs arise for them." (Benevolence Fund Policies and Procedures).

Would you like a way to donate to those in an emergency who are associated in some way with our church? The Benevolence Fund, approved by the Finance Committee and Session in 2014, helps those who have a significant relationship with our local church and are experiencing times of distress. The fund is only for emergency relief to serve a basic need. It is a grant program, not a lending program.

A committee of three members, plus a Pastor and the Missions Coordinator, review applications submitted by those requesting assistance. The three voting church members determine the outcome of the application. This fund is not a line item in the regular operating budget, but a restricted fund filled only by special donations. Your donations will keep the fund working. If you would like to donate, please write a check to the church with Benevolence Fund written in the memo.

Knifty Knitters Donate Items

The Knifty Knitters, a group of Presbyterian Women who knit items for those in need, donated a large number of hats, gloves, and scarves to Kemmerer Village at the December Gathering. (KV serves children through residential treatment and foster care). Other beautiful knitted items are being distributed in the C-U area this winter, with the first distribution site being our church's ESL program and on an "as needed" basis through our Transportation Team.
