Pastor's Pen

I have been pondering a lot on Paul's comment to the Galatians. As usual he is reflecting with a community trying to sort out what it means to get along with each other. He tells them that "the only thing that counts is faith working through love" (*Gal. 5:6*).

How is Jesus asking me to love? That is the question that I keep coming back to. Love and grace transcend the justice of the law. That is what the woman caught in adultery discovered in her interaction with Jesus. Speaking of her condemners, Jesus asks, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She said, "No one, sir". "Neither do I condemn you. Go your way, and from now on do not sin again" (*John 8:10-11*).

Once again, our church is in a cultural transition. Sometimes children annoy us by grabbing a donut hole while we are having coffee or banging the piano during the coffee hour. I believe love calls us to tolerance and understanding. God has placed these children among us. How can we show love and hospitality so that their experience of church is a place they can hardly wait to come and enjoy the presence of Jesus through us? Our job is to get out of the way and allow Jesus to be Jesus who tells us, like he did the disciples when they sternly ordered the children not to touch him and said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs" (*Luke 18:15-16*).

Of course we must set appropriate boundaries. But our main goal is to do it through love and a spirit of hospitality. This is true in everything we do in our relationships with people in community, children and adults. The question is how we welcome others different from us into our communities and churches. How do we create spaces where those different from us feel the welcome love of Jesus?

Jesus loves to challenge us. In the spirit of what I mentioned last Sunday, as we pray for our church to grow and attract families, God will

Company Is Coming July 17

Visiting us from Yogyakarta, Indonesia are our friends and PCUSA Co-Workers, Bernie and Farsijana Adeney-Risakotta. Since 2008, they have developed a close partnership and theological understanding as they have spread Christian ideals to a nation of 220 million Muslims. Eightyfive percent of the total population is Muslim and Christians account for 10%. Through their efforts and others, Indonesia, for the most part, finds these two religions at peace with each other. While they have more Muslims than all of the Middle East put together, very few of them are going to Syria to fight with ISIS, far less than those from the European countries.

On Sunday, July 17, Bernie will preach, Fasijana will work with the church school youth, and both will participate in a joint presentation in Centennial Hall following a luncheon. They have many stories to share about how they are leading various projects where Christians and Muslims work and learn together about each other's faiths. Through their efforts and projects, many of the women and extremely poor are finding ways to elevate themselves from the deep poverty in which many live.

We are celebrating the work of Bernie and Farsijana through this year's Rain Drop offering. As it takes many drops for a beneficial rain, so it is with multiple individuals supporting this project. The program that Farsijana has developed helps struggling women becoming self-supporting. Our financial support will help Farsijana acquire the necessary equipment and ser-

vices. Instead of an offering, we ask that you stop by a table in Westminster next Sunday to look at one or more rain drops that you would like to purchase for this effort. There will be more specific information provided at the table.

Salt and Light needs our help for their Back to School Week, August 1-6. Lists of needed school supplies will be available in Westminster Hall starting July 17 as well as a box for leaving supplies or a donation to help purchase supplies. All supplies will be delivered to Salt and Light on or before July 31.

Our Story Told by Plants

Did you know our church now has a "Story Garden" planted on the southeast side of the Christian Education Building by members of our Environmental Stewardship Committee?

The garden actually tells a story of our church, beliefs and a little about the midwest prairie.

The "anchor" plants that reflect our prairie roots are: Swamp Milkweed, Butterfly Milkweed, Purple Coneflowers, Northern Dropseed grass and Little Bluestem grass.

The elements that tell our own story include three pots representing the Trinity.

Our church is the oldest church in Champaign/Urbana and the pots contain ancient plants referred to in the Bible and found around the world, representing our multicultural congregation, the age of our church and our global mission. These

plants are dill, lavender and mint. They also are used for healing and soothing in other cultures.

The colorful Zinnias reflect the diversity of our congregation.

We mounted the "Story Garden" sign on a re-used post (part of our environmental mission to re-use, reduce and recycle) and in such a way as to represent the cross.

All of the flowering plants were chosen to attract pollinators such as bees and butter-flies (and humming birds) and the grasses produce seeds to help feed small birds in the winter.

Finally, the birdbath provides life-sustaining water for God's smallest creatures.
