Second, for **Jesus is the Way Prison Ministry's** benefit, your financial support is drastically needed to help keep this important prison ministry viable during times when the state is delinquent in paying for services rendered for them.

There is no charge for this banquet, trusting that you will give generously to offset the cost of the meal, but more importantly provide the funds for this primary fundraising program for the year. Incarceration is at an all-time high, as is the recidivism rate [the likelihood of paroled prisoners returning to jail or prison]. In most cases, parolees lack the ability to change their lifestyle or to obtain a job that will provide them with a life in our society.

This ministry is unique in this area in several ways. **Jesus is the Way Prison Ministry** provides Chaplains for correctional facilities in Champaign, Douglas, Ford, Piatt, and Vermilion counties. We also hold regular church services in several Illinois State Prisons. Our New Beginnings Aftercare Program is a residential discipleship program for men who chose to begin a new life based upon the love of Jesus Christ. This unique Christian support network enables men to re-develop basic life skills with support and education in the following areas: Bible study, counseling, corrective thinking/rational thinking, relapse prevention, GED preparation, anger management, money management, employment workshops, leisure skills, stress management, and off-site 12-Step programs. In addition, we help residents enroll in college, obtain driver licenses, library cards, medical care, low income housing applications, and employment opportunities.

NONE OF THE ABOVE HAPPENS WITHOUT THE SUPPORT OF INDIVIDUALS SUCH AS YOU. Make this an extra entertaining evening by calling friends and then arranging for a table for all of you. In the past, we have had several church members attend and enjoy this event.

Habitat for Humanity of Champaign County ReStore will be changing store hours in July to offer a higher level of customer service to its local shoppers and donors. Beginning Wednesday, July 5^{th} , the Restore will be open for customer shopping, donation drop-offs & pickups on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 10 - 6 pm and Saturdays from 10 - 4 pm. The ReStore will be closed on Sundays, Mondays, and open to receive donations on Tuesdays from 10-6.

"We are receiving more donations than ever before, and closing the store on Mondays and Tuesdays will give us more time to process donations and provide a better overall shopping experience," said ReStore Director, Adam Morrisette. A full staff will still be available on Tuesdays to accept and process community donations at the back door, but the store will not be open for shopping. Tuesdays, staff and volunteers will be cleaning, organizing, and preparing the store to feature new donations.

Top Drawer, Habitat's boutique store, will be closing on June 30th. Items previously featured in Top Drawer will still be available for purchase in the ReStore.
