#### **Financial Update**

#### Contributions

Contributions in June were \$17K less than 2016 and \$21K below the budget at \$51K. Despite the dip in contributions the last two months, the Year to Date total continues positive in 2017. This exceeded last year by \$18K and the budgeted amount by \$5K. The increase in this year's contributions continue to offset the decrease in prepaid pledges (those paid in the year prior to the pledge year) for 2017 compared to 2016. These prepaid pledges are prorated over the year with 1/12 added to each month's contributions.

#### Expenses

Year-to-date expenses are \$4K above budget at \$506K but \$18K below 2016. Considering all sources, revenue exceeds expenses by \$31K which is \$31K more than at this time in 2016. This figure includes a \$29K transfer from other funds that was not made last year.
