You Are Never Alone!

Dear Friends:

For one nervous moment, in the summer of my thirteenth year, the United States Coast Guard thought I was dead.

My twelve-foot sailboat had sailed off across the Hampton Roads harbor without me. Frank Henry and I stood on his pier barefooted and empty-handed and watched my little sloop zigzag nonchalantly away before a gentle, off-shore breeze. I was mortified.

“It did what,” Frank’s dad asked? “It sailed away? By itself?” Dr. Henry was incredulous that I could actually lose a whole boat under full sail, but he drove us to the marina, anyway. We jumped into their motorboat, and roared in the direction of my long-gone sailboat.

We found it two nautical miles distant at the Middle Ground Lighthouse; the Coast Guard had already arrived. Dr. Henry insisted I do the talking. Yes, sir, that was my boat, I told the ruddy guardsman shouting down from the deck above our dwarfed outboard. No, sir, there was no other crew with me. Yes, sir, I forgot to wear a lifejacket. No, sir, I wouldn’t let it happen again.

They cancelled their call for a dive crew from Norfolk to search for my body, tossed me the bowline to my boat, and we towed it back to Sunset Creek in Hampton. I was embarrassed, but mostly glad to have my errant boat back. I felt wiser and, possibly, unsinkable.

But the event shook me. Just as unexpectedly as my boat had slipped my grasp and sailed off without me, so, too, death would eventually come for me. I’ll be on the sandy shore one minute, then out on wider seas the next. This was the most ominous existential crisis so far in my tender years: Life was both fleeting and fragile. Even though I thought my death was light-years away, on the summer before eighth grade, death felt like a solid, real thing.

A lifetime of Easters has ingrained in me the belief that I'm never alone. God was with Jesus through life, death, beyond, and back. No, I don't pretend to understand the mechanics of such mystery, but I've been seized by a faith that God loves me like he loves Jesus and stands with me—in this life and the next. So, while life's scary realities still unnerve me, I, nevertheless, wholly trust God's hands are so big nobody can fall out. All will be well.

One day, death will really come. Some Coast Guard chaplain or ER doc will apologetically tell my gathered family that I didn't make it. Summoning a dive crew from Norfolk would not help. Next of kin will be sad, but I'll be whole and well doing whatever it is one does in heaven, glad beyond all measure that God shepherds us through every passage, every change. Death, fear, discord, and a million other sharp-edge worries don't have the final word. God does. And that word is love. That word is life.

My word is *Hallelujah!*

That's what Easter means to me.

Financial Update





Contributions

Contributions in March were \$1K less than in 2017 and equal to the budget at \$71K. The Year to Date total is below last year by \$28K but is above the budgeted amount by \$17K. These figures include prepaid pledges (those paid in the year prior to the budget year) that are prorated over the year with 1/12 added to each month's contributions.

Expenses

Year to Date expenses are \$22K above budget at \$277K and above 2017 by \$18K. Considering all sources, revenue exceeds expenses by \$85K which \$15K less than at the end of March in 2017. This figure includes \$48K more in prepaid pledges than in 2017.

We have gone through the soul searching and surrenders of Lent, and have arrived at Easter and victory through Jesus. 
What do we mean by our sister church in "Luyanó?"

The Presbyterian Reformed Church at Luyanó is the name of our sister church. Luyanó is a neighborhood (borough) in the municipality of "10 de Octubre" which is in Havana Province. The name Luyanó is that of a language of one of the native peoples of Cuba as well as the name of a small stream that traverses the neighborhood.

Mission at Luyanó

There are many mission projects at our church at Luyanó. These include an herb and medicinal garden, an after school program for at risk children, a breakfast feeding program for the poor elderly, a monthly cultural program at the church, and an ESL program.

The church provides filtered drinking water for the neighborhood and exercise classes for the elderly. These programs are funded by external support from congregations like ours and our partner, Covenant Presbyterian in Austin, Texas.
