Courage Connection has been doing their work virtually as much as possible just as the rest of us and yet continues to support residential clients and run the 24/7 hotline.

C-U Canteen Run - Giving Tuesday is May 5 and Canteen Run wants to make sure we know to give to Salvation Army on their behalf. Salvation Army pays for the driver's gas and provides insurance for Canteen Run. Here is an update from April 3. I love how our Mission Partners in CU are working together!!

The Canteen Run program has recently changed, yet the mission to serve our street friends remains the same!

Our scheduled stops and inclusion of awesome volunteers in the truck has been replaced with one driver going out Monday thru Thursday, sometimes Friday, delivering the same essential items (sack lunch, t-shirts, underwear, socks, and

hygiene to name a few) to our street friends.

The only scheduled stops we make now are at <u>Austins Place</u>, serving about 14 woman, and <u>C-U at Home</u>, serving about 50 men. All 64 of these men and women have no other shelter options, and are Champaign Urbana's chronic homeless.

In addition to the drops we are making at the shelters, the drivers are driving around looking for individuals on the street at night, building a phone number list for our street friends that refuse to shelter. Text messages connect the drivers each night with our friends so we can locate them and make sure they have what they need.

We are still counting on all of our supporters for the needed donations to support the Canteen Run efforts. If you are able to donate t-shirts, underwear, or other items, please message us, and we will arrange to pick up those items from you.

There is a list of items that Salt and Light will accept as donations right now: clothes and shoes (in any condition), accessories (purses, belts, jewelry, etc.), appliances (in good working condition that do not require

installation), household and kitchen items, health and beauty items (unopened), children's toys, linens, sheets, blankets, towels, books, dvds, cds, and video games, flat screen tvs and computers (in good working condition) and antiques. 
